## **Course Description:**

This course introduces principles, theories, and case studies in the responsible development and management of tourism destinations. The course assists students in learning to identify opportunities for integrating tourism with other economic sectors to achieve an area's sustainable development.

Ecotourism is a form of sustainable tourism within a natural and cultural heritage area where community participation, protection and management of natural resources, cultural and indigenous knowledge and practices, environmental education and ethics, as well as economic benefits, are fostered and pursued for the enrichment of host communities and satisfaction of visitors.

**Pre-requisites:** Background in economics; introductory finance and marketing is an advantage.

Course Learning Outcomes: (what the students will learn or achieve at the end of the course)

At the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Discuss principles and theories on responsible tourism development in relation to the tourism sector's potential contribution to the achievement of poverty reduction and sustainable development.
- 2. Apply the basic concepts and principles of responsible tourism development using simple decision or planning frameworks for various initiatives.
- 3. Evaluate the social return on investment for ventures involving the environment and heritage aspects of the business.
- 4. Realize the potential of ecotourism in their own business or country-specific environments.

Interactive lecture discussions, case discussions, fieldwork, guest speakers, group case presentations
